

for the Olympic Games Opening Ceremony in London on July 27th.

The Catshill pupils were joined by 249 other schools from across the UK that made up the 2,000 student Guard of Honour.

The youngsters held lanterns and banners that they had created to support the Somalian team. For many of the athletes this Guard of Honour was their first experience of the London 2012 Games.

Catshill Middle School was selected for this prestigious event through the

reward and recognition programme of the Get Set network (the official London 2012 education programme) because they had demonstrated a commitment to living the Olympic and Paralympic Values and for incorporating them into their school lives and curriculum.

As well as having the opportunity to cheer on the world's best athletes and be part of that amazing global moment, the students also got the chance to tour the Olympic Park and see some of the London 2012 venues before the world turned its attention to Danny Boyle's wonderful Opening Ceremony in the Olympic Stadium.

A Message from the Chair

WE are coming to the end of quite an eventful year having enjoyed the Queens Diamond Jubilee and the Olympic Games held here in Great Britain. Our own community games held in June on the Catshill meadow proved to be a success for the community. We held a useful Village Showcase on Saturday 22nd September and will report in more detail in our next newsletter. We now have a few further events to look forward to including the annual firework display at the meadow on

Saturday 3rd November and Remembrance Sunday on 11th November.

It looks like our community is due to increase in numbers with Bromsgrove District Council having granted permission for 80 new homes on land off Church Road and 16 new dwellings on land off Cobnall Road. In addition we have been notified of an application to build 8 new houses on land off Oak Road, using the site of unused garages. All of this will undoubtedly increase the traffic within the parish.



I am concerned about the crime related incidents that have occurred within the parish recently; if you see anything which seems suspicious then please contact our Community Support Officer Kirsten Bowkett using the local police number, contact details are below.

Adverse weather conditions over the summer caused difficulties for some residents who had to deal with flash flooding. It would appear that the culvert in Green Lane

cannot cope with the sheer volume of water on occasions such as we experienced at the end of June! However the North Worcestershire Water Management team are aware of the situation and we fully expect them to produce an appropriate scheme for tackling the problem in the future.

This summer the village entered into the spirit of the Games and had an afternoon's fun competing in some more traditional sports such as egg and spoon race, three legged race and space hopper racing!

Well the annual fund day was being planned as usual by the North West Ward Association when they were approached to see if they were interested in combining the event with a celebration of the London 2012 Olympics. Equipment was available via lottery funding at a National level and the Parish and County Councillors provided some additional funding to support the event.

The weather was set fair for the morning and it was with great anticipation that we invited Helen Russell a locally born athlete to open the event. Helen went to Catshill Middle School and later went on the become 2012 European Sprint Duathlon Champion and 2011 World Sprint Duathlon Champion, Duathlon is a very demanding event involving a run – bike – run combination that tests competitor's stamina to the max.

Helen officially opened the event and as with previous years the clouds instantly opened with a torrential downpour that lasted 15 minutes! Not that this put the competitors and stall holders off.

There was an afternoon of fun and games on the Meadow culminating with a tug of war competition which was keenly fought as there was a pint of Tardebigge cider on offer for each member of the winning team.

Roy Hartle - Catshill's FA Cup Winner!

IN each edition we like to bring you a photograph from the past. This editions photograph is not of a place, but a person... Roy Hartle, FA Cup winner with Bolton Wanderers in 1958!

Roy was born in Woodrow Lane Catshill on 4th October 1931, and went to school in the village, and also attended the Youth Club that was very active at the time. Roy would spend much of his childhood playing football with his friends on the old recreation ground playing field that is now the Lingfield Walk / Aintree Close area off Green Lane. After school he worked at local companies including a brief spell at the Austin motor works; but football was his passion.

He played for Worcestershire County, and was spotted by Bolton wanderer's scouts who saw him play against Staffordshire in a match played on the Bromsgrove Rovers pitch. Clearly impressed with the young player, the scouts went to his home that evening, and signed him right away as an amateur. Because he was not yet a full professional he also played for Bromsgrove Rovers, but then after his national service was completed in 1952 he became a full-time professional footballer

for Bolton Wanderers. By 1955 he was a first team regular as a full back; from then until 1965, he missed only 20 games for the club. At times he captained the side and although a tough defender, was never sent off in his entire career. His playing days with Bolton ended in 1966, having made 499 appearances and scoring 11 goals.

Roy's greatest sporting moment was in 1958 when he was an FA Cup winner when Bolton Wanderers beat Manchester United 2-0 in the Wembley final.

Roy was rewarded for his loyalty to Bolton with a testimonial in 1969, and to this day, in recognition, Bolton's Reebok Stadium has "The Roy Hartle Suite."

Sadly Roy has not enjoyed the best of health in recent years having suffered a stroke, but he is still fondly remembered not only by those who knew him from his younger days in Catshill but by thousands of Bolton Wanderers fans who regard him as true sporting hero. We wish him well.

Make a Difference

ONSIDE is a registered charity providing independent advocacy, mentoring and befriending to vulnerable adults facing disadvantage through mental and physical ill health, learning disability and old age, depression, dementia, autism, learning difficulties. We provide our service across Worcestershire and we are currently looking to train more volunteers from your local area.



Advocacy is a way of supporting and empowering people to ensure that they have their voice heard and their wishes made known to others and we are looking for volunteers to provide this support in their local area. It can involve just supporting someone to sort paperwork out or attending hospital appointments with someone.

Mentor & befriending volunteers are needed to provide a supportive and reliable relationship to people who would otherwise be socially isolated. Opportunities are also available for telephone befrienders and to support local groups which focus on gardening, art, walking and social activities. We also have our drop in service which provides help for people with Autism, along with one to one support for this project.

Onside's Volunteer Co-ordinator, Claire Watkins, said "Our volunteers provide the support and friendship required by the

members of our community who might otherwise be ignored. Our volunteers give their time, their passion and enthusiasm we need continued help from willing volunteers who would enjoy supporting adults in their local community."

Volunteering with Onside is a flexible commitment; as little as 2 hours a month can be given with full training and the option to work towards an Open College Network qualification offered.

Volunteers enjoy the flexible aspect of our work along with the chance to join in at our local social events we run for volunteers including quiz nights and coffee mornings. The comment that really sums it up came from one volunteers - "I seem to make a difference every time I visit, she laughs and I do, she had cheered up as she hadn't seen anyone else all week"

We are currently arranging our next training course and places are limited.

New Councillors Wanted!

FOLLOWING a few changes in personnel on the parish council we are looking to coopt 2 new members. Anyone over the age of 18 can apply for the role of parish councillor; you don't need to be party-political as the only qualifications required are that you live in the parish or within 3 miles of it, are included on the electoral register and have not been disqualified from standing for office for any reason. We would very much like to hear from the under-represented members of the community such as young people and women but will not rule out any applicant on the basis of age, gender, race or religion. Parish Councillors are required to attend monthly meetings and relevant committee meetings, usually held on Thursday evenings at Catshill Village Hall. If you would like to have your voice heard as a representative of your community then why not give it a go?

Catshill Library - The Future

WORCESTERSHIRE County Council has been seeking the views of residents on the future of Library services in Catshill as the existing library building in Barley Mow Lane is in a poor state of repair and will be expensive to refurbish to an acceptable standard. Other limitations such as inadequate parking facilities, the need to use staff from other library sites, the limited floor area in the library, which limits the quality and range of service and low user numbers, make the library unsustainable at its present location. A co-located part time library service to an existing building is a cost effective and more sustainable approach but would require volunteers to come forward from the community to help make it viable. Volunteers would be trained and supported by Bromsgrove Library staff providing professional advice and support.

It has been suggested that the new library offer could include:

- Books and magazines
- A place to sit and read
- PCs and Internet access
- Community Centre Facilities
- Youth provision
- · Bounce and Rhyme sessions for babies and toddlers
- Children's' story time
- · Readers groups
- Adult Learning Groups

The public consultation ended on 14th September and we are now awaiting the results which will be presented at a feedback event on Wednesday 3rd October at Catshill Middle School, starting at 7pm.

New Garden

JUST as the last newsletter was about to be printed, the new garden at the junction of Barley Mow Lane and the Birmingham Road was planted. This now brings the total gardens maintained by the Parish Council (via a contractor) to three. They are:

1) The established Ivy Gardens; next to the Ivy Cottage pub, which has a mix of attractive shrub planting along with a raised railway sleeper bed which has formal bedding planting each year.



- **2) The Diamond Jubilee Garden** on the corner of Braces Lane and the Birmingham Road which is now beautifully established and looking magnificent.
- 3) The new garden at the top of **Barley Mow Lane**. This is intended to be less formal garden, and takes the form of three circles of specially chosen shrubs that will, once fully established compliment the natural wild plants that are already in the centre of this grassy area. Although the majority of the new plants have grown over the summer, we are aware that a few have struggled, and may need replacing. Gardens of this type often have a way of recovering, but we will continue to monitor its progress.

We have no plans to create any further gardens at present, but we do hope you will continue to enjoy the three we have over the coming years.
