Remembrance Sunday

REMEMBRANCE Day this year is on Sunday 8th November and it will be 97 years since the First World War ended at 11:00 a.m. on November 11th 1918.

As usual we will be commemorating this occasion and remembering those who died in the two world wars.

First there will be a combined Christian service organised by the Methodist, Baptist and Anglican churches at Catshill Social Club (formerly Catshill Workmen's Club) on the corner of Meadow Road and Stourbridge Road. This will start at 10:00 a.m. and will finish with enough time for everybody to make their way across the road to the Memorial.

The service at the Memorial commences at 10:45 a.m. and will include suitable hymns and prayers as well as a secular element of the reading of a poem by one of the youngsters in the Parish. The names of all the men will be read out and The Last Post will sound at 11:00 a.m. followed by the two-minutes silence.

After the service all attending are invited back to the Social Club for refreshments.

Recently the Memorial has been cleaned, the lettering of the names re-inked and the statue of the soldier painted. We are grateful to members of the Royal British Legion for funding this maintenance and the company of S. Bright & Sons of Sidemoor for carrying out the work. A short service of dedication will take place at 11:00 a.m. on Sunday 25th October

In the future, further work will be required on both the Memorial and the surrounding grounds and to pay for it, collection boxes will be left at the exit of the Social Club on 8th November should anybody wish to contribute.

In the Social Club, we will have on display the two volumes normally kept in a cabinet at Christ Church that contain details of the men whose names are on the Memorial. Anyone attending will be welcome to view these records. We are always interested in adding to this archive and would be grateful to hear from anybody who has further information particularly from any living relatives. There is an excellent web site at www.everymanremembered.org with details of all the fallen from the First World War where you can look up names and if you wish, add your own tribute.

Finally we always need help on the day particularly with stewarding and serving of





The OLD CLOCK SHOP and the "lost" half crown

THE property now known as The Old Clock Shop in Meadow Road was built in 1926 as a home and **Post Office** for Hector Stokes and his wife. Hector became the Catshill Village Postmaster and remained so for many years.

The Post Office remained at this location until the 1950s when it was moved to a property just a little further down Meadow Road where it remained until its recent move into the Spar supermarket in Golden Cross Lane.





When the Post Office moved out of what is now the Old Clock Shop, it became a convenience store which was run by Mr and Mrs Sleep. It then became a dress shop which was run by Mrs Eve Tromans until the mid 1970s when Mr Ron Wood turned it into a jewellers / watch and clock makers.

Rod Healey joined Ron's business in the late 1970s before eventually buying it in the mid 1990s.

Rod knows many fascinating facts about the shop, and even has a pair of original scales and letter rack that were used there when it was the village post office. He also has an interesting tale of **Bobby Stokes and his lost half a crown...**

"Let's go back to 1940 when the Post Office (now The Old Clock Shop) in Meadow Road, Catshill was run by Mr. and Mrs. Stokes. They had two children; a son and

daughter. One morning, a bag of shiny, bright new half crowns (2/6d) arrived, and as Mrs. Stokes was unpacking them, her little boy Bobby, jumped up and down asking his mother if he could have one. He played up until, defeated, Mrs Stokes gave him one of the coins. Triumphantly, Bobby ran upstairs to his room and lay on his bed, throwing his new coin into the air and catching it again. Suddenly it slipped off the bed and slid behind the skirting board. Bobby tried in vain to fish it out but never succeeded. It was lost forever under the floor boards!



Many years later Bobby, as an elderly gentleman returned to the shop (which was by now The Old Clock Shop) many times, and one day related his story to Rod (who now owns and runs the Old Clock Shop). He told Rod that if he were to ever pull the ceiling down (situated in the main front shop) to look out for his 2/6d.

Eventually, in 2007 renovation work began and the ceiling in the front shop was pulled down. As the work progressed something fell and hit the floor. It was Bobby's 1940 2/6d! The side that had been exposed was filthy, but the other side was still shiny.

Rod would have loved to have returned the unspent coin, but sadly Bobby had died some time before.

New Garden Update



AS we often mention, your Parish Council maintains three garden areas within the parish. They are the **Ivy Gardens**, by the former Ivy Cottage public house (which is shortly to become a Co-Op store), The **Diamond Jubilee Garden** at the junction of Braces Lane and the A38, and the three rustic planted areas at the junction of **Barley Mow Lane and**



the A38. All three gardens have looked especially beautiful this year and we can now give more details of the fourth garden we are about to create and maintain...

We have now secured a peppercorn rent agreement with the Baptist Church which will allow us to landscape, plant and maintain the corner where The Dock joins Barley Mow Lane/Gibb Lane, by the mini roundabout. This is an exciting project which will further enhance our community.

We hope that by the next edition of this newsletter we will have started the work and will update you on the progress.



Better Bus Shelters



THE Parish Council has been committed to a policy for improving facilities for users of all transport systems, especially our local bus services. Over the last few years, we have been looking at the state of our bus shelters. So far we have replaced two existing shelters with new and better ones, and installed another where previously there had been none. Because we only have limited financial resources, this is an ongoing programme but we aim to install, refurbish or replace at least one new shelter each year.

We have already received correspondence, from some members of the parish, with suggestions for locations for new shelters, and, of course, several of your councillors have their ideas as to what they would like to see, but perhaps you have your own views about which shelter you think needs replacing or a bus stop, without a shelter, which is well used and needs one? Please contact us, by letter, email or telephone, with your ideas, we would love to hear them.
