It has been reported that the infill work at the Marlbrook Tip should be completed by Summer 2009, according to a report from the Marlbrook Tip Monitoring Committee.

Police and PACT

West Mercia Constabulary have established 145 new Local Policing Areas, which have a dedicated Local Policing Team, consisting of at least one Local Police Officer and a Community Support Officer. Local Policing Teams are supported by response. At the moment at Bromsgrove North we have a Sergeant, four local policing officers and three CSO's.

They work as part of broader neighbourhood teams, including local councillors, neighbourhood managers and housing managers, youth workers and local businesses as well as community and voluntary organisations.

It is important that the officers engage with communities to reduce levels of worry about crime and ensure that their perceptions of crime levels better reflect reality. By engaging with the community they gain a better understanding of the Crime and anti-social behaviour that affects people. A great way they can gather information is through PACT, which stands for Partners And Communities Together. This is their approach to local community engagement, where they want people to get involved and play a leading role in shaping and influencing local priorities.

PACT sets up meetings, surgeries, environmental audits, face to face surveys and postcard boxes where local people can raise issues and vote to prioritise these issues for a panel of key partners. These partners will then be tasked by the panel to action these priorities and report on progress at the next meeting. The next PACT meeting will be held on Monday 15th June 2009 at 7pm, at Catshill Baptist Church.

PACT surgeries are held on the first Saturday of each month at Bromsgrove North Office (next to the Ambulance Station off the Birmingham Road) between 13.00 and 14.00 hrs

In order to reduce the level of Anti Social Behaviour activities are being organised for the youths in Bromsgrove. In partnership with others they have organised Music Production, Dance, DJ-ing and Percussion workshops that are available for free to anyone who is interested.
