A Message from the Chair

We start another year with the controversial development of land off Church Road which for many years has been used only by our natural fauna and flora and for informal recreation such as walking. We are not sure yet how many houses will be accommodated on the site but planning permission has been granted for 'up residential units'. At the moment the developers are clearing the land before the start of the nesting season and

they have yet to submit detailed information about the style of housing and where it will go.

With new government legislation on the Localism Act, it is possible that the parish council will be involved in the production of a Neighbourhood Plan. This will give the parish council, and you, a bigger say on planning matters within the parish so we hope you will come forward with your views.

This year it looks as if the Catshill Music Festival is generating wider interest with



more venues lined up, so please support these events between 16th -31st March.

The council are always looking for ideas to promote the parish so if you have any suggestions do send them to us. One topic we are looking into is to record the history of the parish; if you have anything that could support this project then do please send your articles to the parish office.

For over 30 years it has defended the Green Belt and keeps a watching brief on planning applications raising objections where attractive buildings or green spaces are threatened. The Local History Group carries out research and holds regular speaker meetings on local history topics.

A number of books have been published such as *Bygone Bromsgrove* and *The Bromsgrove Guild* and the popular annual local history magazine *The Bromsgrove Rousler* is available for £2.50 at Catshill Post Office and Willowbrook Garden Centre.

Many people will remember a fish and chip shop in Woodrow Lane which was trading before and for a while at the same time as the current shop in Golden Cross Lane. However, Haywood's Fish and Chip shop was in Meadow Lane and was in operation much earlier. This photograph shows Mr & Mrs Sam Haywood and their son Matthew outside the shop in the 1930's. Haywood's chip shop was very popular for many years and was



used by villagers and people from the surrounding area, including many of the workers from the nearby Barnsley Hall Hospital who would walk across the fields to buy their lunch. Since its launch through the TV programme River Cottage in 2009 the scheme has grown into a thriving community of more than 67,000 growers, sharers and helpers nationally.

The Environment & Highways committee of your Parish Council believe that this scheme has great potential for our area.
