

What Your Parish Council Does For You

THE Parish Council works for the community of Catshill and North Marlbrook in a variety of ways. There is a focus at present on enhancing the professionalism of Parish Councils and in turn allowing greater delegation of responsibilities from District Councils. The Local Council Award Scheme allows Councils to demonstrate their competence at managing a professional service and Catshill and North Marlbrook are working towards obtaining an accreditation in this area.

Your Parish Council has a wide range of responsibilities and within these is the provision of some services such as the Litter Picker to keep the area tidy and the Lengthsman to keep the ditches and pathways clear. There is a rolling programme being implemented to replace and maintain the Bus shelters in the village and gardens have been created and maintained to enhance the area for parishioners.

Grants have been provided from the Parish Council to assist local organisations and community groups and the flood alleviation scheme has been enhanced by the addition of trees around the balancing pools.

The Parish Council also maintains the War Memorial and assists with the organisation of the Remembrance Day Service each November, in addition to contributing to local events and working with the Scouts to provide the Annual Bonfire and Firework Display on the Meadow.

The Parish Council is currently embarking on the production of a Neighbourhood Plan and needs your help and input as it is a community document and not owned by the Council. An article dedicated to this is located in this newsletter and more information will be posted on Notice Boards and the website in due course.

The Clerk to the Parish Council is available to take local issues and queries and liaises with Worcester County Council and Bromsgrove District Council if concerns fall outside our remit.

This is your Parish, and if you wish to see Catshill and North Marlbrook maintain its identity, please join us at our meetings to discuss relevant issues and the way forward. Full Parish Council Meetings are held on the last Thursday of each month (except August and December) at 7:30pm at Catshill Village Hall with additional Committee Meetings held in between these times. All Agendas are published on the website and Notice Boards prior to the meeting.


Parking on Grass

THE Parish Council has, over many years, dealt with complaints regarding parking on grass verges in the village and attempted in various ways to discourage people from doing so. Recently, in particular, concerns were being raised regarding parking on the slip road in Golden Cross Lane and how it was causing the grass to become muddy and churned. With the assistance of District Councillor Shirley Webb and County Councillor Sheila Blagg there has now been a new low fence erected along the inside of this slip road which will hopefully be successful in preventing parking issues in the future.

Ivy Cottage Footpath

YOU may have been aware of the situation that occurred towards the end of last year regarding the loss of path outside the new Co-op on Gibb Lane. The Parish Council were particularly concerned about the implications this had for pedestrians causing the need to enter the road to negotiate that particularly busy corner. Due to this the Parish Council worked with Bromsgrove District Councillor Shirley Webb, Worcestershire County Councillor Sheila Blagg and the developers to establish a footpath around the outside of the newly erected fence. After the developers levelled the back car park, they kindly donated a small piece of land for County to maintain in the future, therefore making a smooth footpath for the public right of way. Councillor Shirley Webb would like to thank the developers for their cooperation and the Parish Council are pleased with the outcome that has been established when working with the District and County Councils.

Catshill Churchyard

THE Churchyard opposite Christ Church on the Stourbridge Road has been used by Catshill people for around 80 years to lay their relatives to rest. Over the years, the area known by many locals as The Cemetery has grown considerably as more plots have been taken and there is no longer any room for new plots to be dug. Though bereaved families sign to say they will maintain the area around it when they apply for a plot, as they get older or possibly move away from the area, the plot becomes overgrown and has to be maintained by others.

Unfortunately, Bromsgrove Council does not have the responsibility to maintain the Churchyard. Until now, Christ Church has managed the upkeep of the area with considerable help from the Welcome Hall Evangelical Church and the Probation Service. Unfortunately, as we all grow older, fewer people are able to help with this maintenance and we are in imminent danger of the Churchyard getting overgrown. Whilst the Probation Service will cut it periodically, they are unable to guarantee to keep it tidy throughout the growing season.

What we are hoping to do is to put together a group of "friends" who have access to motorised strimmers and who could meet together approximately once a month during the growing season to keep the area tidy. With continued help from the Probation Service and Christ Church congregation itself, the grass could be kept short and the Churchyard will remain a pleasant place to visit loved ones in their final resting places.

The Parish Council Needs Your Help!

AT the recent Annual Parish Meeting the Parish Council launched proposals to formulate a 'Neighbourhood Plan' for the local Parish area.

To enable us to produce this 'Neighbourhood Plan' we will need the active support of a number of local people who would be willing to become members of a steering group that will have responsibility for driving the 'Neighbourhood Plan' forward.

The concept of 'Neighbourhood Plans' was introduced under the Localism Act 2011 and they are fundamentally about giving rights to local communities about the type, location, size, pace and design of developments in their area.

Neighbourhood Plans can:

- Decide where and what type of developments should happen in the neighbourhood area
- Include policies such as on design standards, which could take precedence over existing policies in the Bromsgrove District Council Local Plan for the neighbourhood.

The Neighbourhood Plan must primarily be about the use and development of land and could include the following:

- *Housing developments, including affordable homes, and bringing vacant and derelict housing back into use.*
- Provision for business to set up and expand their business.
- Issues around roads, cycling, walking and disabled access.
- Development of schools, places of worship, health, leisure and entertainment facilities, community and youth centres and village halls.
- Protection and creation of open space, nature reserves, allotments, sports pitches, play area, parks and garden, and tree planting.
- Protection of important buildings and historic assets.
- Promotion of renewable energy projects.

A formally adapted Neighbourhood Plan will be part of the statutory development for the area. There is a legal requirement for Bromsgrove District Council to take into account the contents of local Neighbourhood Plans when making future decisions on planning for those areas.

Parish Councils are required to work with members of their local community in the formulation of the Neighbourhood Plan.

We wish to establish a 'Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group', which will consist of a combination of Parish Councillors and members of the local community, who are interested in working with us to develop this plan. In effect it is your plan so we need your input to ensure that we develop a plan that is fit for purpose for your community.

If any of you are interested in becoming a member of this steering group we would be grateful if you could register your interest with the Parish Clerk.

We will be arranging a meeting in the near future of all interested parties.

Christmas For The Elderly, Isolated And Alone



DO you know someone who will be alone this Christmas? Do you know of a member of the village who is elderly and will not be able to enjoy Christmas as they should?

Catshill Village Hall has been booked on 21st December 2016 in order to provide Christmas dinner with all the trimmings for people who will have no family, live alone or are elderly and will be unable to

provide for themselves this festive season. This free of charge event will enable up to 50 people, initially from the Catshill and North Marlbrook Parish, to enjoy entertainment including live music and a visit from the big man himself in the hopes of spreading some Christmas light and cheer to those most in need.

However, for this event to work we need your help. Although all the material elements of this event are in place to help our Community, the event has been funded and will be run by volunteers within the Parish; we now need assistance with identifying people who would benefit from such an inspiring, caring and thoughtful provision to enable us to invite them to the event. Eligible people include those who are over 60 years of age, living alone or as a couple with no family dependents, those registered with charitable bodies for lonely people and those who are immobile or disabled. April 2016 Dear All.

A year has passed since I last wrote – a year that seems to have passed very quickly. Easter is with us – I write on Easter Saturday, the Saturday after Easter Day. For those who are familiar with the Church year we now wait 50 days for Pentecost or Whitsun. Unlike Christmas and Easter, Pentecost is rarely observed these days except in Church and with one or two lingering Whit Walks. There is still a Whit Friday Brass Band Contest in and around Saddleworth. It used to coincide with the Whit Holiday Week but that is now fixed with Bank Holiday on the last Monday in May. I must look up if there were any traditions for Whitsun in Catshill.

The two names are based on the timing and events of the first Pentecost; that's the timing one, while Whitsun is the event – White Sunday – the coming of the Holy Spirit.

Pentecost in the church is the time we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit on the first disciples, which changed them from fearful men locked in an upper room to preachers who went out to tell of Jesus, crucified and risen. They then offered the invitation to believe and trust in Jesus, to be baptised and receive the Holy Spirit for themselves. We still celebrate this today and Churches Together in Bromsgrove are meeting from 3 pm on Sunday 15th May for Pentecost Praise in Sanders Park.

Spring is a lovely time of year as the trees begin to blossom and the leaves have that lovely new green look. And summer is not far ahead. Enjoy every moment that you can. Take time to appreciate the world around.
