

On a more positive note, we installed three *Chatty Benches* during 2024, one of which we have recently moved to Millennium Way near Catshill Fields

on Milton Road, as it has proved such a popular spot. These benches are a simple way to reduce loneliness and isolation by encouraging conversation and community spirit.

IN the Spring edition we had an old photograph of the Crown Hotel (as it was known in around 1905) by the War memorial. But what many people may not be aware of is that there used to be another public house just across the road from the Crown called the Vine.



The Vine was situated where the entrance to Westfields is now (by the mini roundabout next to the War Memorial). The actual building has been long since demolished. This photograph taken in 1905 has been kindly supplied by Michael Wagstaff from his late father Roy's collection – thank you!

Catshill used to have several other pubs that are no longer in existence; so many that the authorities at one time forced the closure of some, the Vine being one. The actual building was not demolished immediately and was used by a merchant for many years until it was eventually demolished to make way for the Westfields development.
